



*In the 1000 years of Jewish life in Poland, Jews and Poles became both intertwined and separate. Periods of great social intercourse and later bitter economic rivalry came to be part of their collective history. During the Holocaust in Nazi-occupied Poland, those relationships formed and broken by history were brought to the brink of extinction by Germany. ## Program

The collaborative efforts of Miami Dade College's Holocaust and Genocide Education Program with the Jagiellonian University's Center for Holocaust Studies were initiated to offer students the opportunity to study not only the Holocaust but to study the Holocaust in its Jewish and Polish context.

The program offers courses for academic credit taught by scholars from the Jagiellonian University. All lectures and course materials are in English and designed for transferability to US institutions of higher education.

## Explore

Integral to the academic program are the co-curricular activities. Each weekend, students will have access to guided tours of various Holocaust, Jewish, and Polish historical sites. All tours will be lead by Center for Holocaust Studies staff as well as local guides. Tours and reading materials will be in English.
